Update on IPv6 Allocation Transfers

IPv6 Allocation Transfers




- IPv6 allocation stockpiling was <u>discussed</u> during RIPE 88 in the Address Policy Working Group session
- Based on the Working Group's guidance, Registration Services began prioritising policy enforcement in June 2024
- Maintaining a flexible approach to find optimal solutions, such as returning unused allocations by the receiving party or post-transfer returns to avoid re-signing transfer agreements
- Overall good acceptance from involved parties, with only a few expressing disagreement
- The approach appears effective, still supporting the transfer of needed IPv6 allocations while encouraging the return of unneeded ones

Development IPv6 Transfers







- Transferred allocations dropped by 90% from the previous four months and 70% compared to the same period last year
- Of the 76 transferred allocations in the last four months, 30 were immediately returned, or other allocations were returned in their place.

More Consideration



- Registration Services is applying a similar approach for LIR consolidation, as policy requirements apply per LIR
- Registration Services carefully reviews cases where the receiving party previously transferred their IPv6 allocation and now requests another, either via transfer or directly from the RIPE NCC - this is evaluated on a case by case basis
- The RIPE NCC plans to audit members with multiple IPv6 allocations to better understand their needs and ensure policy compliance



Update on IXP Assignments


IXP Pool



- In September 2023, policy proposal "2023-01: Reducing IXP IPv4 assignment default size to a /26" reached consensus and was implemented
- Proposal aimed to extend the RIPE NCC IPv4 pool's lifespan by reducing the default assignment size
- 12 months have passed, time for a first review...


Approved IXP IPv4 Assignments

Conclusion



- Current average monthly assignment rate is ~/26
- RIPE NCC's pool for IXPs: ~/16,/21 (68,352 IPs)
- Subsequent estimated depletion date: Somewhere in the next century

Temporary Transfers

Temporary Transfers



- The RIPE transfer policy allows both permanent and temporary transfers
- During RIPE 86 potential challenges around temporary transfers were <u>presented</u>:
 - Extreme short or long transfer periods
 - Different rules in terms of holding period and transferability
 - Complications if something happens to the involved parties during the transfer period

Good News



- The <u>RIPE NCC transfer procedure</u> was updated to address cases where changes occur with the involved parties during the transfer period
 - Members: If the Receiving Party's membership is terminated, resources return to the Offering Party immediately; if the Offering Party's membership is terminated, RIPE NCC will deregister the resources at the end of the transfer period.
 - Sponsored Resources: If the Receiving Party's sponsorship ends and isn't renewed, the resources return to the Offering Party. If the Offering Party does not have or re-establish sponsorship, the resources will be deregistered.
 - Sanctions: If the Offering Party is sanctioned after the transfer period, resources stay under RIPE NCC control until sanctions lift; if the Receiving Party is sanctioned, resources return to the Offering Party.

Less Good News



• The RIPE NCC continues to receive temporary transfer requests for periods ranging from a few days to over 10 years.

RIPE NCC publishes all transferred resources with details as outlined in the <u>RIPE Transfer</u>
<u>Policy</u>

This list will contain information about approved changes. The following information will be published:

- The name of the offering party
- The resource originally held by the offering party
- The name(s) of the receiving party or parties
- Each subdivided prefix (each partial block derived from that original block) or resource received
- The date each resource was transferred
- Whether it was a transfer according to this policy or a transfer due to changes to an organisation's business structure (such as a merger or acquisition)

Transfer Statistics
