Summary

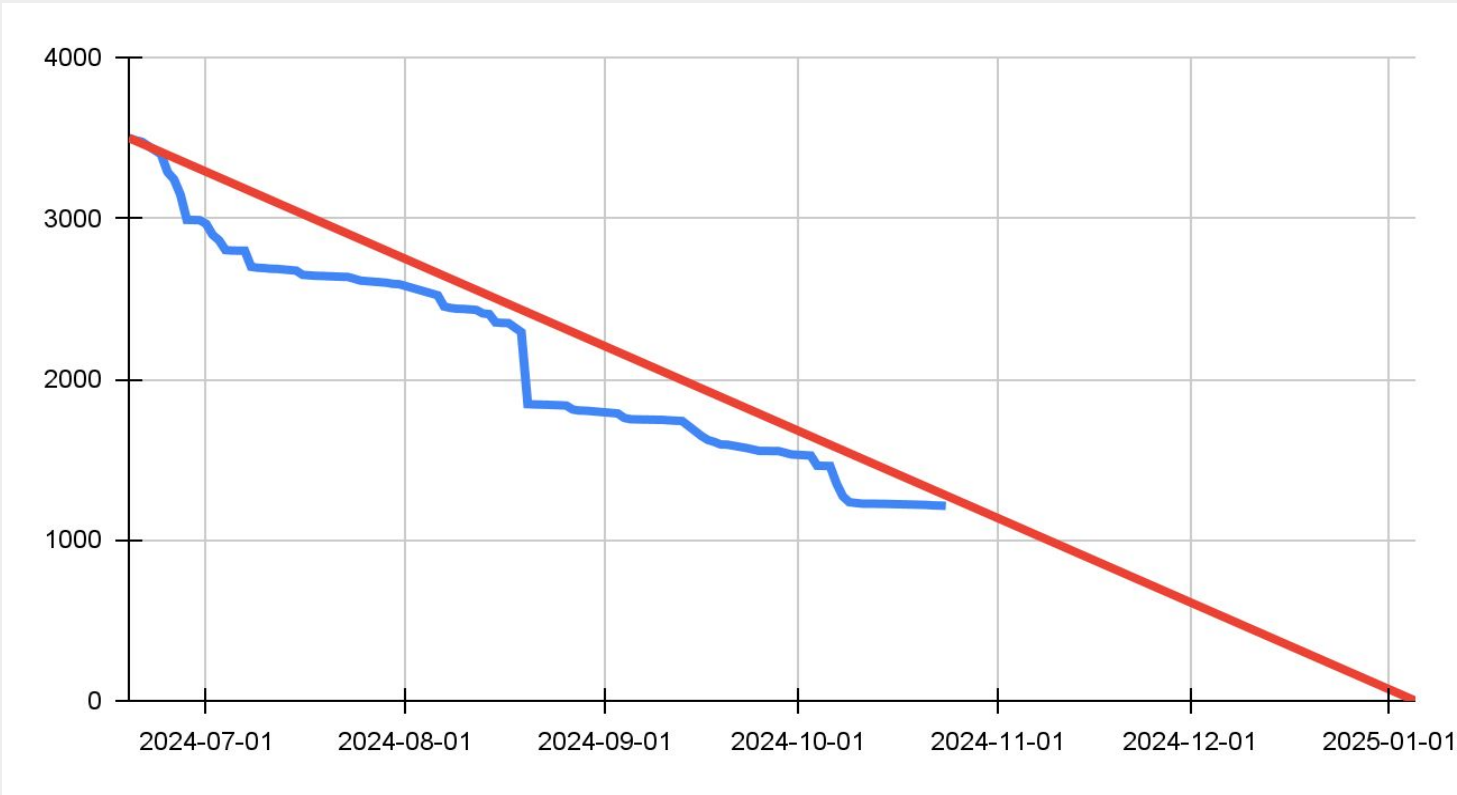
- Proposed in May 2024 in a RIPE Labs article

- Community supported the proposal
- Implementation started in June 2024, and is ongoing



Process

- 18 June 2024 - RIPE NCC no longer accepts new delegations with this name server
- 19 June 2024 - emails sent to users, with relevant information
 - Emails sent to zone-c, tech-c and admin-c
- Most users are able to do updates without our help
- A small number of tickets came in, and were resolved easily
- We keep sending reminders at the start of each month

Stragglers

- Initially, emails did not always reach the right people
 - From October, we began emailing contacts in the matching address space
 - inetnum and inet6num objects
- We reached out to the bigger users by phone - effective
- Still have over 1000 domain objects to go
- Deadline is 31 December 2024
- We will update remaining objects in mid January 2025
 - Some zones will be left with just one name server
 - Not allowed by RFC 1034, but DNS resolution does work with one name server



Status

- 19 instances of AuthDNS
- 120 instances of K-root
- There is quite a lot of redundancy and resiliency in the K-root service
- We are seeking hosts for AuthDNS

- Requirements
 - Server (Dell or virtual)
 - 32 GB RAM, 500 GB disk
 - 2 network interfaces and out-of-band access
